

A first-generation Somali immigrant father, raised in Ottawa and drawn into a life of crime during Alberta's early 2000s oil boom, must confront his turbulent past alongside his adopted son as they navigate a legacy of generational trauma and cyclical violence, culminating in a powerful confrontation.
