

PROJECT - HOUSE ARREST

A complex and corrupt pharmaceutical tycoon, Ritchie (played by Nollywood star Richard Mofe-Damijo, RMD), is placed under house arrest in a secluded mansion after being charged with money laundering tied to pharmaceutical corruption in Africa. As he hides from the public, he and his family are haunted by a vengeful demonic presence that threatens to unravel their darkest secrets.

My objectives for EFM are threefold, to: (1) connect with international distributors for our feature documentary film in post-production "Learning in the Shadows"; (2) meet with genre distributors for our horror feature, filming in 2025, "House Arrest", starring Nollywood icon RMD; and, (3) expand our international networks.




PROJECT - HEGEMON

PROJECT - CETTE TERRE M'APPELLERA MAÎTRE

A Canadian Filmmaker embarks on a personal quest in Guadeloupe, a French territory in the Caribbean region, the birthplace of her parents where her cultural heritage is. In this road movie-style documentary, we follow her as she investigates the generational conflicts in her family due to land inheritance. Gradually, this leads her to unveil one of the biggest taboos in the island: indivisible land ownership. She also sheds light on the impact of the French colonial legacy on Guadeloupean families. A thrilling tale examining neo-colonialism through the prism of land governance.
